

START A TROOP

Important to the development of the BBI network is the organization of localized troops. We wish to pass on some suggestions from our experience.

A few friends is all it took to get started. We knew only 3 other fans of Buckaroo Banzai, and from there we just made others welcome to join in. We encouraged everyone to tell others about Team Banzai and to bring friends along to activities.

As you begin to form a troop, it is necessary that the person who does all the organizing of local BBIs has an outgoing personality, and the free time available to carry out the job. Generally this person does the calling of BBIs for get-togethers. Someone else may hear of an activity or suggest a social gathering, but the troop director should have a master phone list and get in touch with those interested or available. One exception is if someone wants to host a party in their own home. The host is then responsible for contacting troop members, and inviting them to the activity, not the director.

Gatherings should be based around common interests. At first, they can take place on "neutral ground" such as parks, theaters, shopping malls, conventions, restaurants, fairs or carnivals, sporting events, concerts or the classroom. Since it seems that many fans are on tight budgets, costs for activities should be kept to a minimum. For instance, our troop goes to movie premieres using free passes from local radio. stations. As people get to know each other, and feel more comfortable as a group, the gatherings can move to the homes of troop members.

Be visible as active members of Team Banzai. Wear Banzai buttons, T-shirts, jackets and patches when you're doing everyday things, as well as when you're at fan gatherings. The convention is an opportunity that all BBIs should take part in. This is where you'll meet others with similar interests that will make new friends and BBI recruits.

Don't be afraid to say NO. Be aware of the fact that fandom attracts all sorts, and that not everyone is going to fit in with your troop. We explain it this way: members must fit into the existing group attitudes and philosophies. This relates to subjects of conversation, tolerance of language and maturity, respect for non-smokers, use of intoxicants (legal or not) and acceptable behavior. Also be aware that some fans are what we casually call "social vampires", because they are only out to "take" from the group. These types don't participate in conversations, volunteer their time or support, but do take advantage of refreshments and entertainment! Everyone should be given the opportunity to fit in with your



group, but remember that not everyone who wants to get involved, should. We have experienced about a 35% "turn over" rate, and sometimes we just have to be "selective" with invitations.

One last thing, don't push or intimidate anyone into doing things they don't really want to. We often use the phrase "just want to let you know about the opportunity." This keeps it casual and fun for everyone.

For those of you who are organizing your own troops, feel free to contact us with questions concerning specific situations. We will pay special attention to your needs and try to help with the dilemmas that can occur!

We are anxious to hear from any active and organized BBIS!


